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Biography

Christina McPhee's work investigates ways of knowing through methodologies of pattern 'discognition' across painting, drawing, photomontage and video. Solo exhibitions and/or museum collections include the Whitney Museum of American Art and the International Center for Photography, New York; the American University Museum; Bildmuseet, Umeå, Sweden; Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art, Kansas City, Great Plains and Sheldon Art Museums at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art at Washington State University. Solo gallery shows include Left Field, Irenic Projects, Cerritos College Art Gallery, and Jessica Silverman galleries in California; KinoSaito Art Center and Sara Tecchia Gallery in New York; and Thresholds New Media Collection, Scotland. Recent group exhibitions include Otherwise/Revival, Bridge Projects Los Angeles (2021) and the forthcoming Voynich Meditations: A Medieval Manuscript and Contemporary Art, Wonzimer Gallery, Los Angeles (2024).

A participating artist-editor for Documenta 12 in Germany, McPhee's writing on media arts theory and culture appear in books published by CTheory and Intellect Books. She has been honored with residencies at the HumLab at the University of Umea; Columbia College Chicago, Scripps College Claremont (as Langland Alumna in Residence); Anderson Ranch Art Center, Snowmass (teaching residency); and Banff Center Media and Visual Arts in Canada. McPhee is a Ucross Foundation Fellow (2019), and an artist in residence at Jentel (2024), Wyoming. Together with composer/performer Pamela Z she won a MAP Fund award for creation of *Carbon Song Cycle*, a multi-channel video and chamber music work on atmospheric climate change, which premiered at Berkeley Art Museum/Pacific Film Archive in 2013. In revival at the Exploratorium, San Francisco in August 2023. Christina McPhee was born in LA County, grew up on the Great Plains, and studied painting at Kansas City Art Institute (BFA), and Boston University (MFA painting, a student of Philip Guston). She lives and works on the central coast as a guest on the traditional lands of Chumash and Salinan communities. She is left-handed.
